Session 1: SYSTEMS, INEQUALITIES & MOVING FEMINISM INTO THE 21ST CENTURY

The rules, usually created without women in the room, have long been embedded in systems. What are those patriarchal systems at play and how do we better understand and expose them to change? Women have taken the most significant hit during the pandemic, especially front-line workers and women of color. We will explore the systems that keep inequality in place, the decision-making behind them, the barriers that remain, and how a 21st century feminism might bring about the change we seek.

Session 2: A WOMAN'S WORK, HEALTH & FAMILY LIFE REIMAGINED

The pandemic, racial protests and demands on women caretakers as mothers and educators have pulled back the curtain on the inequities and burdens that have been baked into a woman's work and life. With an

understanding of the systems and play, we will take a deeper look at our world of work, our health and healthcare systems including reproductive healthcare, and the different shapes and definitions of families – single, single moms, LGBTQ, traditional and others, and how roles and responsibilities could be reshaped and re-imagined as younger generations and society demand.
